Malpractice Instructions

To ensure the integrity and fairness of the examination process, any student found indulging in malpractice will face strict disciplinary action. The following actions are considered as malpractice:

- 1. Bringing any materials like notes, books, mobile phones or any electronic devices into the examination hall that can assist in cheating is prohibited. All students must ensure they do not have any unauthorized material on their person.
- 2. Copying or attempting to copy answers from fellow students is strictly prohibited. Both the student copying and the student being copied from will be subject to disciplinary action.
- 3. Using unauthorized technological devices such as smart watches, mobile phones or calculators (unless specified by the exam guidelines) is considered malpractice. These devices should be turned off and placed in the designated area outside the examination hall.
- 4. Any form of plagiarism, whether copying from books, websites or other students' work, will result in severe disciplinary actions. All answers should be your own work.
- 5. Creating disturbances, communicating with others or attempting to disrupt the exam environment will be treated as misconduct.
- 6. Any student caught submitting forged documents or fraudulent exam-related materials will face immediate disciplinary actions.
- 7. Any attempt to tamper with answer sheets, mark sheets, or any exam-related documents will lead to cancellation of the exam and further disciplinary actions.
